<ul> <li>Knows what a complete sentence looks like.</li> <li>Composes a sentence orally before writing it</li> <li>Draws on stories they know to inform their language and sentence structure in their writing.</li> <li>Sequences events to form a narrative.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Knows the terms fiction and non-fiction</li> <li>Uses key features of narrative in their own writing: beginnings and endings</li> <li>Links sentences together with increasing fluency to form a short narrative</li> <li>Uses the language and features of nonfiction texts.</li> <li>Writes narratives about personal experiences and those of others (real and fictional)</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Separates words with spaces</li> <li>Begins to punctuate sentences using a capital letter and a full stop, question mark or exclamation mark.</li> <li>Uses a capital letter for names of people, places, the days of the week, and the personal pronoun 'I'</li> </ul>	Re – reads     what they have     written to     check that it     makes sense.	<ul> <li>Knows what a noun, adjective verb and connective is.</li> <li>Expands noun phrases to describe and specify [for example, the blue butterfly]</li> <li>Identifies and records some key vocabulary to use in their own writing.</li> <li>Uses some connectives: and, but.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Knows and discusses familiar story themes and characters.</li> <li>Discusses reasons for incidents in stories.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Segments spoken words into phonemes and representing these by graphemes, spelling many correctly.</li> <li>Forms lower-case letters of the correct size relative to one another.</li> <li>Writes capital letters and digits of the correct size, orientation and relationship to one another and to lower case letters.</li> <li>Uses spacing between words that reflects the size of the letters.</li> </ul>
