



On Friday 26th April, Vicky from the Suffolk Wildlife Trust spent the day with the children in Early Years as part of our wilder schools' project.

School Uniform

As we move into Summer uniform, please could I remind you to follow our school uniform guidance. In particular, children should be wearing black school shoes and plain grey/black socks (no logo) or white socks for girls with their summer dresses.

Please see our uniform guidance below.

<u>Boys</u> – Grey trousers/shorts, grey or black socks (no logo), V necked navy blue jumper, pale blue polo shirt.

<u>Girls</u> – Grey skirt or trousers, V necked navy blue jumper or cardigan, pale blue polo shirt, grey or black socks/tights (winter), blue checked dress and white socks (summer).

<u>Shoes</u> – Black shoes must be sensible and appropriate. Shoes with heels are discouraged and should be low.

<u>Indoor PE</u> – Navy nylon PE shorts, white PE t-shirt, plimsolls (preferably slip-on for the younger children). Trainers are not allowed for indoor PE.

<u>Outdoor PE</u> – Trainers, navy tracksuit/jogging bottoms and a sweatshirt top. Please do not use tops with zips or drawstrings as these can cause injury.

<u>Jewellery/Hair/Make-up</u> — Children are allowed to wear one small pair of stud earrings. No jewellery is to be worn during a PE lesson. Children should not come to school with dyed or highly gelled hair, or wearing any face/eye make-up or nail polish.

Safer Driving outside the School



We have been made aware of some instances of drivers using excessive speed in Garden Lane, particularly if they are running late! Please keep to the speed limit and consider the safety of the children at all times.



End of the School Day

Please could you make sure that you leave the grounds promptly with your child at the end of the school day. The gates will be locked promptly at the end of the day.

Wraparound Childcare Questionnaire



If you are a parent of a child aged 0-11, Suffolk County Council need your help to tell them how and where they should plan extra provision to be most convenient to parents. 'Wraparound' provision will be increased where there is demand – this means term time childcare before school (from 08:00) and after school (until 18:00). Wraparound provision can be with a school, or with a private, voluntary or independent provider or with a registered childminder. Wraparound care is a service which would need to be paid for by families.
